

- Texas nonprofits especially nonprofits serving communities outside of major metropolitan areas and those with budgets of less than \$100,000— rely on volunteers to carry out their mission and meet community needs.
- The pandemic has caused a lot of disruptions among the volunteer workforce of nonprofits.



BEFORE THE PANDEMIC

78%

of respondents depended on volunteers to support their organization. BECAUSE OF THE PANDEMIC

58%

of respondents have endured severe reductions in utilizing volunteers for delivering programs and services.*

(n=516)

^{*} This goes up to 76% of respondents when also including moderately reduced impact of volunteers.


OneStar has partnered with Resilia, a social impact technology organization, to give 25 nonprofits access to their exclusive online platform.



Faith-Based & Community Organizations

- Congregations
- National denominations and their affiliates and networks (e.g., Catholic Charities, United Methodist Hospital, and Habitat for Humanity)
- Independent faith-based organizations (e.g., Salvation Army)
- Community-based organizations (e.g., a community group leading a neighborhood revitalization project)
- Nonprofit organizations (e.g., a local food bank or children's shelter)



Interagency Coordinating Group Roles & Responsibilities



The Interagency Coordinating Group plays an important role in supporting the State's collaboration with FBCOs overall.



Work Across State Agencies

Work across agencies to remove unnecessary interagency barriers to FBCO partnership.



Promote Effective Partnerships

Promote the value and effectiveness of partnerships between agencies and organizations to serve Texas residents in need.



Develop & Implement Best Practices & Plans

Develop and promote agency best practices for collaborating with FBCOs and develop and implement a plan for improved contracting relationships.



Identify & Address Opportunities for Improvement

Identify and address duplication of services provided by the state and FBCOs and gaps in state services that FBCOs could fill.






- Statewide volunteer connector platform, directing volunteers to local service opportunities posted by organizations across the state
- Developed in partnership with Points of Light utilizing the technology behind the Points of Light: Engage aggregator
- VolunteerTX pulls opportunities from a state network of Volunteer Connector Organizations (VCOs), AARP, United Way, the HandsOn Network, and more to help connect volunteers with opportunities that inspire them to serve
