- 2011 **Dissertation Title: Formation of Ukraine's Foreign Policy Identity**
The dissertation studies the evolvement of Ukraine's foreign policy identity in interaction with Russia, EU, and US. The intersubjective quality of the foreign policy identity is operationalized through the concept of social recognition. The lack of thin social recognition from Russia solidifies Ukraine's search for recognition via membership in the European Union, which becomes a core element of its foreign policy identity.
