What is the Bush Board Fellows Program?

The Bush Board Fellows is a program sponsored by the Center for Nonprofits & Philanthropy that allows Bush School students to serve as **non-voting board members for a local nonprofit organization**. This program provides an excellent opportunity for students to experience board meetings, understand how finance and strategic decisions are made, network with professionals and community members, and apply classroom learning to real organizations.

Program Expectations:

- Upper-level Undergraduate and Graduate Bush School students are eligible to participate
- Service term is Spring semester (January) - Fall semester (December)
- Regularly attend the organization's board meetings (*Approximately once per month*)
- Actively engage with the board to best serve the organization
- Attend check-in and training sessions (*Approximately twice per semester*)
